

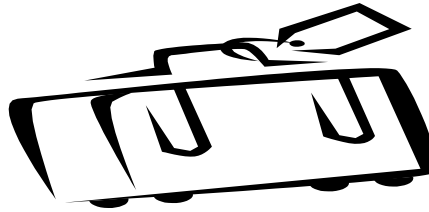

## COURSE OUTLINE

### Course Description:

This course focuses on travel and tourism as the vehicle for studying selected world regions. Using a variety of geotechnologies and inquiry and communication methods, students will conduct and present case studies that develop their understanding of the unique characteristics of selected world regions; the environment, cultural, economic, and political factors that influence travel and tourism; and the impact of the travel industry on communities and environments around the world (Canadian and World Studies, 2005).
